BankExec Groups

Bank group assignments are available in the "Bank Groups" document on the webpage.

Before coming to the South Carolina Bankers School, group members should email each other and ensure that your team is bringing at least one laptop computer with spreadsheet, presentation graphics, and word processing capabilities. You will need the computer to access the simulation and to prepare a presentation of your results.

Additional computers are a plus since multiple team members may sign into the model simultaneously, and the extra computers make it easier to complete the presentation.

Some groups also bring a small printer and paper, but it is not a requirement.

BankExec Presession Materials Introduction

The presentations and exercises on this webpage are intended to assist you in preparing for the BankExec simulation. They familiarize you with the simulation model and its output, and help you begin to analyze the starting financial position of the bank your team will manage.

There are four presentations and two exercises. The total preparation time is expected to be about three to four hours, but you do not have to complete everything in one sitting. All presentations may be stopped and restarted at any time.

To be fully prepared for the simulation, follow the steps below.

- 1. Watch the first two presentations.
- 2. Print the "Printable PDF of Starting Position" and thumb through it as you watch the third presentation.
- 3. Watch the fourth presentation and then complete the "Getting to Know BankExec Exercise."
- 4. Complete the "Starting Point Financial Data Exercise" using the "Printable PDF of Starting Position."

5. Bring a copy of the "Printable PDF of Starting Position" and the completed "Starting Point Financial Data Exercise" with you the first day of the program.

When we begin the BankExec sessions, we will discuss how to set bank goals and put them into action. We will use the initial session to review the most important parts of the presession activities and discuss the remaining issues you need to understand to start the simulation. We will then make our first decision.
